ANTONIO'S STORY



"Psychologists define resilience as the process of adapting well in the face of adversity, trauma, tragedy, threats, or significant sources of stress. A part of me truly believes that I define resilience."

Prior to Growing Home, I traveled down a complicated road: I experienced two frame-ups, two wrongful convictions, and a host of systemic and social rejections which ultimately led to interpersonal rejections as well as familial estrangements. On July 23rd 1997, I was framed for the second time, being sentenced to 103 years in prison. All because of a rogue Detective named Reynaldo Guevara who has been accused of falsely framing over 50 people for murder.

I did make it out of the Mountains (prison). However, I lacked the experiences you would get during your 20s and 30s. Anything I could've accomplished and learned at that time had all vanished into that empty space between time. I was getting every door closed in my face until I came to Growing Home. The staff took immediate action to help me get acclimated.

Growing Home is not just about growing vegetables, it's also about helping build character. With manual labor, I was taught to apply myself diligently. Growing Home teaches you how to do the basics: clock-in, build a strong resume, conduct interviews, etc. They also teach you the information you'll need to bring the best out of yourself. If you want to grow and you want to be productive, then you should be healthy. You should put the right things in your body, so you can give yourself the best chance at being able to rise above your current position, to succeed on your future mission. We all have the potential to reach Success with Growing Home.

In March 2020, Antonio was released from prison due to an emergency clemency petition from the Exoneration Project of University of Chicago, finding his way to Growing Home. To read Antonio's full story and learn about his current and future journey as a graduate, visit growinghomeinc.org/antonio.

Growing Home's Employment Training Program supports those with the highest barriers to employment as we work to increase employment access equity in Chicago.

Our Participants in 2021

- 64% live in Englewood
- Range in age from 18 to 62, a median age of 32
- 90% are African American or Black
- 45% are female, and 55% are male
- 50% have minor children
- 87% have been justice-involved
- 100% of our participants are low-income


