The inclusive and warm embrace that Growing Home offers to people of all walks of life cannot be understated. But I'd like to highlight one important characteristic of our Growing Home family: our creativity.

This year, I was blown away as we:

- Envisioned and launched our farm space as an Information Technology training program to expand our workforce development services.
- Fulfilled new social enterprise food access partnerships to ensure our produce is getting to those who need it without more growing space.
- Launched monthly farm stand events with over 100 attendees like Summer Grilling, Yoga, Juneteenth, local vendors and cooking demos.
- Supported our alumni to combine their diverse pathways and time at Growing Home to step into new and exciting roles in manufacturing, water management, transportation and information technology.
- Started our most creative project yet: the launch of our Farm Site Expansion Capital Campaign to convert our corner vacant lot on 59th & Wood St into a state-of-the art growing, learning and community center.

C's Story

When C. interviewed to become a part of the employment training program here at Growing Home, he was one week away from graduating from a substance abuse recovery program. C. also informed us that he had a justice involved background that he was not proud of. He passionately stated that he wanted to do something different with his life. He was living at the recovery center and looking for training to prepare him to re-enter the workforce and start a new career.

C. was grateful for the support and training, but he was still frustrated and concerned about making it through the program and succeeding in a new job. While attending the employment training program, C. graduated from the substance abuse program, transitioned out of the substance abuse shelter, and moved in with his mother. Shortly after moving in with his mother, she was diagnosed with a disease, which proved to be very demanding in terms of him having to provide total care of her and her medical needs. This left C. with a huge load, having just finished a drug recovery program, caring for a mother alone, and trying to train for a new career. C. remained committed to the program and attended all scheduled training classes.

C. often mentioned how grateful he was for the support from the employment training & case management staff going the extra mile to help him make it through. C. graduated from the employment training program, completed his ServSafe Food Handlers Training, and began a full-time position with Chicago Public Schools shortly after graduating. Around the same time that C started his new position with Chicago Public Schools, C. was diagnosed with cancer. C had to make the difficult decision to either start his orientation for the new job, or to start his chemo treatments. He made the decision to go to orientation for his new job. What an outstanding demonstration of courage and determination. C. started his Chemo treatments, and they have not hindered him from going to work every day. He reported that his health is improving. C. has been successfully working on his job for over 4 months now, and as he says, "living his best & blessed life!"

A's Story

A. is a person on a mission to provide a better life for his two young daughters, who recently lost their mother due to a tragic accident. A's has his eye on the world of IT, and is determined to learn everything he can. He has completed IT Essentials, Introduction to Cybersecurity, and Cybersecurity Essentials. A. was also selected to go to San Francisco for the Sephora project. While in San Francisco, he could put his new skills into practice. All while juggling a part-time job, studies, and being a single parent. He and his team mates were awarded a \$100 bonus for seamlessly completing the project on time. He's a real champion!

A. is always there for his daughters, caring for their health, education, and happiness. He helps them with homework, combs their hair, and drives them to and from school. A. also finds time to nurture them by reading and giving them hugs, all while studying for his Network+ Certification. A. inspires our IT class participants and proves that anything is possible with hard work, perseverance, and love.

WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

Growing Home's Employment Training Program supports those with the highest barriers to employment as we work to increase employment access equity in Chicago.

Our Participants in 2023

- 34% live in Englewood
- Range in age from 18 to 66, a median age of 44
- 85% are African American/ Black
- 47% are female, and 53% are male
- 13% have minor children
- 55% have been justice-involved
- 95% of our participants are low-income







OUR IMPACT SO WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

- Production Assistants & Trainees Enrolled 120 (118% increase from 2020)
- Participants completed 1+ professional certifications 94 including ServSafe, CompTia Computer, Roots of Success Environmental Specialist, GED, ForkLift
- Participants either completed parole/probation or 51 reported having their criminal record sealed/expunged.
- of graduates were placed in employment, 24% above the 67% DFSS average for Transitional Job programs in Chicago 64% of placed graduates retained job for 30-days


