JANELLE ST. JOHN | Executive Director, Growing Home



Janelle St. John has been Growing Home's Executive Director since 2020 after being the Chief Fund Development and Communications Officer of Growing Home for over a year. Since her start at Growing Home, Janelle has helped form Growing Home's essential 3-year working plan that includes initiatives geared towards deepening Growing Home's commitment to the Englewood community. Such initiatives included increasing Growing Home's food distribution in Englewood to 50% or more, a goal which has been achieved and surpassed in the first years with 61% distribution in Greater Englewood last year.

Prior to Growing Home, Janelle spent five years as the Chief Development and Communications Officer and later Chief Strategy Officer for Edgewater Health, a Community Mental Health Center located in Gary, IN. She is a dynamic senior level professional with over 23 years of superior performance within the nonprofit industry. She holds a master's degree in Public Service Administration from DePaul University and a bachelor's degree in Political Science from the University of Chicago.

On her passion for leading this unique urban farm non-profit, Janelle shares, "Growing Home, Inc. allows me the unique opportunity to make a difference in a community that I am very passionate about. I live only blocks away from Englewood and have many family and friends who are residents of the Englewood Community. Growing Home, Inc. is in a unique position to make an impact in a community that is a designated food desert with high unemployment."

Melinda will oversee program operations and resource development for all Growing Home initiatives, ensuring effective coordination with program directors. In this new position, she will take a proactive role in strategic planning processes and lead the development of Growing Home's new site. Additionally, she will work closely with the Executive Director to keep Growing Home's Board of Directors informed about program strategies and challenges.

Prior to joining Growing Home, Melinda served as the SNAP Outreach Manager and later as the Senior Manager of Public Policy and Benefits at Northern Illinois Food Bank for four and a half years. During the peak of the COVID-19 pandemic, she led a dedicated team of ten, tirelessly assisting neighbors across 102 counties in Illinois. The mission was to connect those in need with vital benefits and resources. Together, her team completed over 10,000 SNAP applications, making a significant impact on food security. Fueled by a lifelong commitment to helping others, she embraced an advocacy role, becoming a voice for neighbors. She raised awareness about food insecurity, whether in Washington, D.C., or

Springfield, championing key bills and advocating for a stronger farm bill. Melinda's sentiment is "it's never just about the paperwork—it's about driving meaningful, lasting change".

For eight years, Melinda served as a Certified Application Counselor at Crusader Community Health, a Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC) in Rockford, IL. In the Outreach and Enrollment Department, she worked closely with individuals at pivotal moments in their lives, providing assistance with Medicaid, Marketplace coverages, and connecting them to vital community resources. Guided by the motto, 'Teach a person to fish,' she believes in empowering others through knowledge and resources to foster self-sufficiency and resilience. Melinda's experiences have shown her the profound impact of extending grace during challenging times.

Melinda holds a Bachelor of Arts degree in Human Services from Judson University and proudly considers herself a lifelong learner. In her free time, Melinda practices self-care through long walks, crafting, painting, reading, and actively participating in church events. It takes a village and this is the best place to promote self sufficiency and empowerment.

EZRA LEE | Director of Urban Farms



Ezra is currently the Director of Urban Farms for Growing Home. Since joining Growing Home's farm team in 2021, they have focused on continuing and enriching the urban farm as a forum for training, education, and vegetable production. Balancing these missions has guided their practices in both the way the farm operates and the cultivation of a team that is compassionate and challenging. During Ezra's time at Growing Home, the farm has updated its growing practices to reflect high production use of the 1.75 acre farm while remaining accessible for trainees, updated infrastructure for long term success including adding retention walls and mixed irrigation, and shifted the vast majority of distribution of the 35,000 lbs of food grown annually on the site to reach people in food insecure communities and especially Englewood.

Ezra's people-first approach to urban agriculture is driven by their experiences growing food on a range of sustainable farms in upstate New York and western Massachusetts. From school gardens to family farms, nonprofits to wholesale distribution, their knowledge of regenerative agriculture both in growing and in structure spans 9 years. Because of the disparity in food access and the difficult financial

nature of small-scale agriculture, Ezra has developed an appreciation and dedication to the work that social enterprises can do to smooth these incongruities by providing material needs, supportive environments, and educational opportunities for local communities.

Ezra holds a bachelor's degree in Politics from Bard College at Simon's Rock and you may spot them rowing on the Chicago river, savoring a meal from Chicago's wealth of cuisine, or trying their own hand at baking.
